




Vernacular or traditional architecture encompasses most of the buildings of the world. It is the architecture of the people, rather than for the people. It is not architectdesigned but is customarily owner-built or communitybuilt, utilising available resources with traditional techniques. This Encyclopedia is the first to show the remarkable diversity of the buildings constructed and lived in by the people of over a thousand cultures.


- The first encyclopedia ever compiled on this subject

- Published in three volumes: Volume 1 focuses on the theories, principles and philosophy that underpin traditional architecture. Volumes 2 and 3 consider these principles within specific cultural contexts
- Comprehensive in scope, covering traditional or folk buildings from the Arctic to Australasia, in cultures ranging from Abelam to the Zuni
- All climatic and environmental zones represented, from montane to desert, lacustrine to riverine, permafrost to oasis
- Every kind of group or culture and its architecture is included, from nomads to pastoralists, peasants to urban dwellers
- Architectural and structural details and principles are described and fully illustrated so that they can be understood by students of other disciplines. Similarly, anthropological principles relating to social structure, family and kinship, religion and belief, are explained where they have bearing on building
- As **building traditions** vary widely within some countries and extend across the political boundaries of others, the Encyclopedia considers vernacular architecture within its cultural rather than its national contexts


